Wisdom

Wisdom is the ability to exercise good judgment. It distinguishes between right and wrong, seeks and upholds truth and justice, and balances personal good with the common good.

Understanding is the gift of intelligence and enlightenment. It is the ability to think clearly; comprehend information; and discern meaning.

Counsel

Counsel allows someone to be directed by God in matters necessary for their salvation. It is also the ability to teach, inform, guide, direct, warn, admonish, recommend, and encourage.

Fortitude is a firmness of mind in doing good and avoiding evil. It is an unwavering commitment to God, showing moral strength, courage, determination, and patient endurance.
