

Dear Parishioners and friends,

As I type this letter, the sky is so beautiful, the temperature is perfect and the air is clear. After all those smoke filled days earlier this summer, and the recent uncomfortable heat and humidity, I couldn't stop thanking God! Even though it is only "weather", it felt to me as though something had lifted.

This weekend we celebrate the Transfiguration of our Lord. Through this event the "veil" which obscures our ability to see Christ as He is was lifted. We, along with the three Disciples who witnessed His Transfiguration, are given the gift of seeing Christ with the clearest of spiritual vision. How desperately we need this "clearest of spiritual vision".

To all who were blessed to see Jesus as He walked in Galilee and Jerusalem, He appeared to be a man like anyone else. I suppose that goes for anyone to this very day who has not had a kind of *transforming* experience of the Lord Jesus. Only those who have had their hearts purified from passions, sins and their effects, are able to recognize Him and that only to the degree to which the Holy Spirit allows.

Evil brings us woes, no matter how hard we try to redefine evil ways as something desirable. We need to experience and celebrate the Transfiguration of Jesus and His transforming power in our lives. Let us reclaim the clear vision that He gives us through the Holy Scriptures and the Holy Spirit. Let the fog clear. Let your hearts be lifted up, raised to the very heights of living in His Divine Will and loving what He loves!

OCIA (Formerly RCIA)

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (formerly "Rite of...") is the process established for the universal Church for individuals to become Catholic Christians and receive the sacraments of initiation, Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist. This initiation process also involves a parish community experiencing a renewal in faith as it prepares and welcomes new members into the Church. The Order speaks of conversion as a "spiritual journey".

Who is OCIA for? Briefly, for 1) Persons in need of Baptism 2) Persons baptized in another Christian tradition who desire to become Catholic. 3) Persons baptized Catholic in need of First Communion and/
