

From the Tastor's Desk



Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The celebration of the Solemnity of Christ the King always marks the end of the Church Year. You know how we have the calendar year and the fiscal year, well as Catholics we also have the

Church year. Currently we are finishing out Year A. Next Sunday will be the first Sunday of Advent, and we will begin Year B.

In the secular world, New Year's Eve is the big celebration of the year past and of the beginning of a new year. The Solemnity of Christ the King is similar. We celebrate all that Christ has accomplished in our lives this past year, and we begin with Advent resolutions to prepare for the Birth of Christ, who is to eternally be our King. It is similar, but very different in that the Church year is not merely a measure and marking of days tracked by a calendar. Christ the King is the climax of the great drama of the Life of Christ not only in history, but in each human heart. And it is intensely personal.

When I say it is personal I mean it is mutually personal to us and to Jesus. We all know that we can have a personal relationship with Jesus. Many speak of having accepted Jesus as their personal savior. The readings for Christ the King teach us how personal it is to Jesus, Himself. Any true relation to the Lord is as personal as it gets. Far beyond anything akin to our feelings and statements, Jesus declares that we are blessed when we see Him hungry and feed Him, naked and clothe Him, ill and care for Him, in prison and visit Him. He takes these actions so seriously that he declares we are "accursed" if we do not relate to Him in these ways. This salvation business is intensely personal to Him. Just ponder for a moment what it cost Him and what it demands of us.

That is why it is so very important for us to have this day called Christ the King every year. He is not only King of the Universe. He is King of our hearts. His story is not just one for the books. It is the ongoing work of Creation, which involves the fall and salvation of man. We are not merely recognizing a title which He deserves. We are asking Him to allow us to be members of His Kingdom. He wants to be our King in all matters. He desires that His Will be our will. It is universally great, and it is all very personal—for Him and for us.
