Dear Parish Family,

Happy Feast Day to all of you. Our Lady of Lourdes, pray for us! On February 11, 1858, the Blessed Mother appeared to Bernadette Soubirous for the first time with a burst of wind that moved a wild rose in the grotto, even though the other trees and bushes were not moving. Then she saw the Lady. In Bernadette's words,

"As I raised my head to look at the grotto, I saw a lady dressed in white, wearing a white dress, a blue girdle and a yellow rose on each foot, the same color as the chain of her rosary; the beads of the rosary were white ... From the niche, or rather the dark alcove behind it, came a dazzling light."

Those two little gusts of wind began a remarkable series of events which have blessed the world from that very moment. The Lady told Bernadette to dig in a specific spot, and we were given the miraculous healing waters of Lourdes. On March 25th the Lady revealed Her title, saying, "I am the Immaculate Conception."

Isn't it inspiring that so much began with a moving rose and an attentive little girl? This is our heritage here at Our Lady of Lourdes Parish. I see that wild rose moving in all that Jesus is doing in everything from our Holy Masses to our youth activities. The dazzling light of the grotto is evident with the celebration of each Sacrament The gust of the Holy Spirit is evident in every meeting, dinner, social activity, intergenerational celebration, family catechesis, and each act of kindness. The rose stirs in the hearts of our staff, our Parish Pastoral Council, Vocations Team, Coordinating Team, the many volunteers, and the various ministries.

The rose stirs. The healing waters flow. The Light of Christ shines. The Blessed Mother smiles.

The tragedy is human trafficking. The Super Bowl and other large-scale events promote fun, parties, and for this month, "what happens in Vegas stays in Vegas" for the thousands involved on or around February 11. So, the wonderful celebration of our Feast Day and the fun of the big game mean nothing but pain for the young men and women, and even children, victims. This horror is not confined to Las Vegas; it can happen in any community. "It is estimated that approximately 1,000,000 people are trafficked each year globally and that between 20,000 and 50,000 are trafficked into the United States, which is one of the largest destinations for victims of the sex-trafficking trade." Above all, pray for hearts to be changed and for the efforts of those working to rescue the victims!


