FOUNDER

Saint John Bosco was born in Becchi, Italy, on August 16, 1815. A devout Catholic from his youth, he was ordained a priest in 1841. As a priest, he took special care of young boys in deplorable conditions during the Industrial Revolution. He had a talent for connecting with the young men, allowing them to be more receptive to the Gospel that he brought to them. In 1859, Fr. Bosco established the Society of St. Francis de Sales, named after the 17th-century bishop of Geneva. Their work continues today, focusing on charity and helping boys form their faith and stay out of trouble.
