From the Pastor's Desk



Dear Parish Family,

After the rather frightening warnings we read at the end of the Church year regarding the end times, the readings for this first week of Advent are a breath of fresh air. They reflect the new beginning we are given any time we come to our Lord Jesus. There *is* a warning given by our Lord in the Gospel. It is, however, a hope-filled warning. I remember that old saying, "Forewarned is forearmed." Advance awareness of a situation, especially a risky one, prepares us to deal with it. I think we must, if we are being honest, admit that each of us is at risk of falling into sinfulness. So Jesus calls us to be ready for His return. Be in a state of grace, and if you fall into sin, avail yourselves of Holy Confession as soon as possible.

"Watch, for you do not know the day or the hour." Like many other scriptural texts, this admonition is addressed to all of us, though it is formulated in such a way that it would seem to concern only Christ's immediate audience. We can all apply it to ourselves because the Last Day and the end of the world will come for each of us on the day we depart this present life. This means we must make sure we die in the state in which we wish to appear on the Day of Judgment.

The Advent season is a four-week period before Christmas that celebrates the anticipation and coming of Jesus Christ, the Messiah. The origin of "advent" is from the Latin word *adventus* which simply translates "coming" or "arrival". Not only is the Christian meaning for preparation and celebration of the coming of Jesus Christ, His birth at Christmas, the new life He brings to all who follow Him, but also the anticipation of His returning again. Each week of Advent may have a theme assigned to the candles being lighted. Usually they are listed, from 1st to 4th: hope, faith, joy and peace.

So be forewarned: Christmas is just around the corner, and the Lord is Coming! Prepare ye the way of the Lord!
