I will always remember that first Christmas after my mother died. Shopping with all the holiday jingles seemed to me to resemble a nightmare more than a celebration. At the time my only consolation was to be found in Church singing "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" and other Advent hymns, reading Scripture and receiving Jesus in Holy Communion. Offering the Sacrifice of the Holy Mass is real. It is neither manufactured or material.

I did get to experience true Christmas joy with the celebration of the Nativity of our Lord. All that other stuff which I so enjoyed in the past was...just stuff. I needed much more. That year there was no fake happiness and frivolity. I couldn't even fake it for the benefit of others. It was strange for me, having always been the smiling face of the secular celebration of the Christmas season. But it was our Lord and His Mass that got me through. There was one other thing that helped me that year-- the Christmas Novena of St. Anthony.

It has been that way for me ever since, not now out of sadness and mourning. The comfort and joy are not born of the seasonal activities. However, our true comfort and joy may well begin for us on this Thanksgiving Day if we truly take the time to be grateful to the Lord for all He has given us. Gratitude. Thanksgiving. Being truly grateful to God at all times is what keeps us (me) from being overwhelmed with concerns, sorrows, and doubt. I may have my moments, but God has my days.

And then join me in praying the Christmas Novena every day, beginning on November 30th. We call it the Christmas Novena, but it is really more of an Advent Novena. Praying that prayer will like nourishing a tender seedling of hope in our hearts. That seedling will become a glorious tree~~a real Christmas Tree~~The Tree of Life which is Christ Jesus, Himself.

Now I can't wait for Advent to begin. In the meantime, Happy Thanksgiving to one and all!
