



Ministry Corner Fifty Years

FARS! Abortion has been lega

FIFTY YEARS! Abortion has been legally killing babies for fifty years in this country. As of last year, more than 63 million babies have died at the hands of abortionists. Yes, Roe v. Wade was overturned last year. We have discussed that and we know that abortion is not illegal in all states. It is sad that we must enact legislation to end it, but would abortion truly end with a law? Murder is illegal, but that hasn't stopped people from killing one another. Armed robbery, assault, rape - any number of actions have been deemed crimes and are illegal - yet they continue. Why? God is not at the center of all of our lives. What can we do about violent sins? We can, and must, pray. We can also take action. The annual March for Life in Washington was not discontinued and probably will not be until the right to life is afforded to all, especially the most vulnerable in our society. Until abortion is unthinkable, we must do what we can to prevent it. To quote Cardinal Timothy Dolan, Archbishop of New York, in #WhyWeMarch, "Our prayers and witness are about civil rights, the civil right to life and to equal protection under the law, guaranteed by our constitution, for the most fragile, marginalized, and threatened, - the tiny, innocent baby in the womb." Certainly, there are physical limitations that may preclude some of us from marching, but we can all pray and we can all speak out! God bless you as you work to end the scourge of abortion in our state and our country!
