



Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in Him may have eternal life."

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The Gospel reading this weekend contains one of the most famous verses in the Bible: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have life." (John 3:16) Though it is not as common as it was about 15-20 years ago, we still see people holding up signs with "JOHN 3:16" written or even scribbled on them. A strange practice by my accounting, because those who are not Christian usually have no idea what is being advertised.

In addition to being a curiosity, I think we sell the message short when the context of that verse is not taken into account. It is not an isolated saying. Rather, this love of God is intimately connected to and finds it's full meaning in the previous 2 verses quoted at the top of this letter.

Jesus, the self identified Son of Man, must be lifted up. That, of course, refers to His Cross upon which He is Crucified and Sacrificed for us. We glory in His Cross, which is a way of saying that without Him, and specifically without the "lifting up", we have nothing of eternal value. Sometimes we Catholics are accused of keeping Jesus on the Cross. Ridiculous! But we must never loose sight of the fact that He did freely offer Himself on the Cross for us.

Just as the Jews remember the Holocaust, Americans remember 9-11, and some people "Remember The Titans", we must remember that Jesus actually died and *then* rose from the dead. We need not try to put it out of our minds because it is not joyful. In fact, knowing this is quite uplifting! We deny neither the death nor the Resurrection. Jesus was both lifted up and raised. Believing in that truth, we are both saved and lifted up.
