

# From the Tastor's Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This past week was filled with joy with our annual Vacation Bible School taking place. We had 35-40 children and about a dozen or more of older kids, along with a wonderful crew of adult volunteers. After a rousing round of singing, we would begin each day with prayer, and then we would read one of the parables which set the theme of the day. It was a grand success, especially with the leadership of Donna Mothersbaugh. It was her first year as coordinator. Great job, Donna!

I mentioned that we read a parable each day because our Gospel this weekend is another one of the Parables our Lord Jesus taught. At VBS we learned that a Parable is a story that Jesus taught using earthly things to explain divine realities, and each parable is a treasure. The parable of the wheat and tares, sometimes called the parable of the wheat and weeds, is another treasure our Lord shares with us. Scripture scholars tell us that this parable can be understood on two or three levels.

The first level is the situation in which Jesus and His disciples were living. Jesus is constantly being criticized for inviting the outcast to eat with Him as an anticipation of God's salvation. He answers by saying that it is for God to make the separation and that God will do so only at the end. Then it will be clear who are the wheat and who are the tares. Doubtless there will be some surprises! For Jesus, the wheat and tares were the disciples verses the authorities (scribes and Pharisees). Secondly, for the evangelist Matthew it was non-believing Israel and the members of his Church. The third level of understanding, as is true for all Scripture for it is truly timeless, is for us. There are tares as well as wheat in the Church now, and there need be no premature attempt to separate the wheat from the tares in its present life. The Lord and His Angels will separate the wheat from the darnel.

Beyond the descriptions, however, is the treasure. At each level the point remains the forbearance of God. What the world does not know is the love and mercy of our Heavenly Father. What the evil one cannot accept is that despite all his evil works, the will of God will triumph. The wheat will be gathered into the barn of God's Kingdom. Amen. Alleluia.
