

I think I already expressed how much joy it brings to this old man's heart that I get to be a part of bringing our children to Christ Jesus. The older students were a bit less enthusiastic about being there, LOL! I fully understand. I'm pretty sure I gave my mother a rough time about CCD and even going to Mass when I was a teenager. My Poor Mom! I was not an easy child to raise. I actually always loved Mass, I just balked when told that I had to go.

Anyway, I get such a kick out of our kids. When I visited the 1st grade class it was almost time for dismissal, so I asked them to show me what they learned and what they did. They learned the "Glory Be", and they were so proud of their coloring sheets. Colsen didn't say much but had a big smile on his face. Elijah was very proud, and said he didn't finish it because he was making sure he did a good job. And my dear Eliza just glowed all over, knowing that she made Father Mike proud. I live for moments like this. Three children came to Church to learn and pray. Three children went home justified!

It truly saddens me to think that some children do not even know they are loved. It equally distresses me to think that many adults, even Church goers, do not experience the loving presence of the Blessed Trinity. He is present. So what keeps us from knowing that? 
All Souls' Day Mass—Commemoration of the Faithful Departed—Wednesday, November 2, at 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.

# Ministry Corner What Does the Catechism Say?

"The inalienable rights of the person must be recognized and respected by civil society and the political authority. These human rights depend neither on single individuals nor on parents, nor do they represent a concession made by society and the state; they belong to the human nature and are inherent in the person by virtue of the creative act from which the person took his origin. Among such fundamental rights one should mention in this regard, every human being's right to life and physical integrity from the moment of conception until death." (2272, CDF, Dominum Vitae III). The Catechism refers to abortion and infanticide as "abominable crimes" (2271). Yet, we are faced with those who would leave the teachings of the Church at the door every Sunday and stride out into the public forum to not only support laws allowing abortion, but promote abortion and infanticide as rights! Even if we do not look at abortion and infanticide through our eyes of faith, we cannot deny that these acts kill a human being. Science has given to us our modern day prenatal ultrasounds that show babies, not blobs of tissue! Promoting abortion and infanticide are, indeed, abominable crimes!
